### Grower Producer

What's the difference? Champagne is a unique region in terms of production. Most of the champagne market is dominated by a handful of the "Grand Marques," who own only about 12% of the vineyards. Purchasing grapes from growers from all over the region is common practice. When you purchase "Grower Producer" Champagne, you are purchasing wine made by the same person who grew the grapes. Logically, the quality level is higher when someone puts their name on their product. Moreover, the subtleties of the wines' terroir comes to the forefront. Lastly, Champagne is the only place in the world where you can find higher quality wine for a better price....take a chance with the small guys.

In terms of the red wine produced here, this equivocates to wonderful silkiness and more supple tannins than the rest of the Medoc.*

## St. Emilion

*Textured, silky, rich, and voluptuous Merlot based wines. It is worth noting that St. Emilion has its own classification system apart from the Medoc Classification of 1855. Premier Grand Cru and Grand Cru Classe are highly regarded distinctions, while Grand Cru is a more common distinction shared by many chateaux.*

## Northern Rhone

Wines of the Northern Rhone are made from the highest-quality Syrah grown in the world. Vineyards are planted on steep hillsides in rocky soil creating just the right environment for Syrah to shine. In general these wines are dark, fairly tannic, and explode with aromas and spice. Throughout the Rhone section you will find the appellation listed first followed by the producer. Marcel Guigal was named *Decanter's* Winemaker of the Year in 2005. Charlie has been stashing Guigal's wines away for over 30 years.

Chateauneuf du Pape allows for up to thirteen other varietals such as Syrah, Mourvedre, and Counoise. These are among the most exciting red wines produced in the world. Southern Rhone wines range from earthy and aromatic to jammy and spicy. Whatever the blend these wines are some of the most compatible with food.
